Volunteers Needed to Help Install Greenway Interpretive Signs Friday, May 27, 9:00 AM and 12:30 PM

The Environment Committee needs a small core of volunteers to work with City personnel to install 5 interpretive signs along the Roanoke River Greenway. We will have 2 shifts; one in the morning, one in the afternoon. Feel free to sign up for both shifts. Our job will be to mix concrete, set and level signs, install anchor to keep sign stable while concrete hardens and direct greenway traffic as necessary. The City will drill the holes, deliver the signs, provide construction tools, and provide water for mixing concrete

The morning shift will meet at the Bennington Greenway trailhead on 13th St. near the sewage treatment plant at 9:00 AM. The afternoon shift will meet at Wasena Park near the bridge to Vic Thomas Park at 12:30 PM. For those who will be "double-dipping," there will be a lunch break at 11:30 AM.
