Kiwanians Install Greenway Interpretive Signs

As part of the Kiwanis Environmental Committee's charge is to support Roanoke City Parks and Recreation's activities on the city's greenway system, Kiwanis focused on installing seven interpretive signs along the Roanoke River Greenway.

In coordination with Renee Powers and Katie Slusher of Parks and Recreation, a group of Kiwanians gathered on a bright Friday morning to install four of the signs. The city provided the tools and dug holes while Kiwanis provided concrete and manpower.

Kiwanis also purchased two new signs that had been destroyed in city floods. Five signs were scheduled for installation but one had location issues, so only four were installed. Volunteers signed up for morning or afternoon installs.

The morning team was so efficient that all four signs were installed in the morning. Jim Randles, Mike Loveman, John Ewart, and Don Witt worked the morning crew. Sheyonn Baker, Alex Bowman, Andy Stone and non-member Mike Adams had volunteered for the afternoon crew but were not needed. The remaining signs will be installed later this summer.

She is the first African American elected as secretary for the VA State Board of Nursing and has received numerous military commendations and community awards.
