**This Week at Kiwanis -
From Crippled Children's Hospital to Level 1 Trauma
Center: The Unintended Consequences of
Government Funds, Integration,
and Not-For-Profit Status.**

Presenter is Derick Stackpole, Physician's Assistant at Carilion Clinic. Roanoke was served by several hospitals in the 1950s including Roanoke Hospital, a not-for-profit subsidized by the railroad, and Burrell Memorial Hospital serving the black community. The introduction of matching federal funds through the Hill-Burton Act of 1948 which provided money to build hospitals in medically underserved areas led these two entities with disparate needs to form the Hospital Development Fund, Inc. Roanoke Hospital wanted to expand services for victims of Polio and the outdated Burrell Hospital needed a new building.
