

## **Capital District Update:**

Several Kiwanians attended the Kiwanis Capital District Convention (DCON) two weekends ago and brought back a great report. For newer members, the Roanoke club is part of the Capital District of Kiwanis International, which includes all of the Kiwanis clubs in Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, Washington DC, and West Virginia - 4,500 members representing 166 clubs.

- Approximately 275 Capital District Kiwanians and family members attended the District Convention held in Baltimore August 19-21. Roanoke, the second largest club in the district, was well represented as current Lt. Governor Don Witt (and Ellen), Past Lt. Gov. Hi Nicely, Past Roanoke Presidents Cheri Hartman (and Dave) and Mike McEvoy (and Gail) and Roanoke Secretary-Treasurer John Montgomery (and Joyce) made the trip.
- The convention opened Friday night with a major league baseball game at nearby Camden Yards where the home team Orioles outlasted the Boston Red Sox in a 15-10 slugfest that entertained the crowd.
- "Be More in Baltimore" was this year's convention theme; a wide spectrum of educational opportunities was offered on Saturday. Cheri and Dave presented a well-attended workshop Saturday morning on Inclusion. Kiwanis International Executive Director Stan Soderstrom, from Indianapolis, was the Saturday luncheon keynote speaker. Soderstrom paid tribute to the Capital District's own Art Riley, who was in attendance. Art is Kiwanis International's Immediate Past President.
- Capital District Governor Elana Gardner's (Eastern Branch) banquet Saturday
  was another highlight of the weekend. Tysons Kiwanian Jen Wolff was installed
  as the incoming governor Sunday morning and Charlottesville's Eric Lamb was
  successful in his campaign for Governor-Elect.
- The Ducky Derby exceeded its goal of \$14,000 this year, proceeds support neonatal intensive care units across the district, including the NICU at Carilion Children's. Roanoke had three winners in the Saturday afternoon drawing: Bruce Swanson (an Amazon gift card), Joyce Montgomery (a Lowe's gift card) and Eddie Barnes (a \$250 check). Roanoke's \$844 contribution helped Division 15 lead the 20-division District for the eighth consecutive year. Hi Nicely was elected incoming Capital District Foundation president. Mike McEvoy also won two gift baskets as part of the Caring Corner fundraiser.
