I have studied the subject, researched it, and tried to practice it.



Here is an example. When climbing Mt. Aconcagua, one of the world's seven summits, we would carry excruciatingly heavy loads up the mountain and pre-position them for later, return, and do it again the next day. The altitude's thin air, steep and unsure terrain, and bitter cold did not help. I knew I was on a high performance team when one morning, as we gathered to pick up a load from the pile set out by our guide to carry up the mountain, the first climber did not pick up the lightest load.
