





May 17th Club Meeting - Legislative Update

- Kiwanian Chris Head has represented the 17th District in the Virginia House of Delegates since 2012. Delegate Head currently serves as Vice Chair of the House Committee on Health, Welfare, and Institutions, and on the Commerce and Energy, Privileges and Elections, and Rules committees. He also serves as Co-Chair of Virginia's Small Business Commission. In 2022, Delegate Head received the Free Enterprise Award from the Virginia Chamber of Commerce in recognition of his legislative efforts in support of health insurance options for small businesses as well as the Industrial Strength Leadership Award from the Virginia Manufacturers Association PAC. He is a husband, father, grandfather, and business owner, who lives in Botetourt County and owns a senior care business in Roanoke along with Betsy, his wife of 33 years.
- John S. Edwards, born October 6, 1943, in Roanoke, Virginia, is the son of the late Judge Richard T. Edwards and Augusta Saul Edwards Farrier. He is married to Cathye Dabney Edwards and they have three children, Jack, Dabney and Catherine, and seven grandchildren. They are members of Christ Lutheran Church in Roanoke.

In November of 1995, Edwards unseated a Republican incumbent to win a seat in the Senate of Virginia, representing the 21st District. He was re-elected in 1999, 2003, 2007, 2011, 2015 and 2019. In the Senate, he has served as Chair of the Rules Committee, Chair of the Civil Law Subcommittee, and Chair of the Higher Education Subcommittee. He has served on the Transportation and Privileges & Elections Committees. In 2020 he became Chair of the Judiciary Committee, which had previously been called Courts of Justice. He also currently serves on the Finance, Commerce & Labor, Education & Health, and Rules Committees.





May 24th Club Meeting - Jeremy Holmes

Jeremy Holmes, Executive Director of the Roanoke Valley-Alleghany Regional Commission, will be presenting Get to Know the Roanoke Valley Transportation Planning Organization (RVTPO). The RVTPO is the federally-designated planning organization for the urbanized Roanoke Valley. Decisions here influence everything from I-81 widening, to Greenway expansion, to bike lanes, to roundabouts, and now electric vehicle infrastructure. Learn how the RVTPO makes decisions and how you as citizens can get involved in making sure our urban transportation network meets your needs.

Jeremy Holmes has been with the Roanoke Valley Alleghany Regional Commission for 17 years. Until 2021, he served as the Director of RIDE Solutions, the regional sustainable transportation program. In 2021, he became the organizations sixth Executive Director, overseeing all aspects of its regional transportation, community development, economic, and environmental planning efforts.
