President's Message

Yes, outreach is the theme of my presidency. No, it is not new. I have been championing outreach for a number of years. I have also been acting on it. Outreach explains why I added a non-Club member to the Environment Committee that I chaired, it explains why I did an exhaustive deep-dive reading one thousand pages in peer-reviewed journals about civic organization membership, it explains why I supported the leaders of the Nature Park in adding non-Club members to the project team, it explains why I designed our new Club website, it explains why I developed and received funding for a plan to advance Kiwanis awareness, and it explains why I partnered with a non-Kiwanis organization on KPAD. I could go on; you get the pattern.

My focus on outreach is based not only on civic organization research, but also on the informal survey I conducted where I found only 4% of the people

I surveyed in Roanoke knew anything about our Club. That's right, in spite of being the largest Club in the Kiwanis Capitol Distract, and one of the largest clubs in the world, we are a well kept secret here in Roanoke; only 4% know anything about us.

Here is a rhetorical question. If so few people know about our Club, how can we turn around our stagnant decade-long lack of membership growth? I don't see how we can unless we get serious about outreach. So, at the center of every activity we engage in, at the center of every committee we have, and at the center of every Club event, I wonder how we can get the word out. I wonder how we can reach out to the community to share our good story. We do have a good story, a great story. I wonder how each member, regardless of how active on social media they might be, can get the word out; many of us have kids and grandkids that are active on social media that can spread the word for us. I wonder how each committee or event planner can get the word out. I wonder how we can engage our expanded Communications committee to help us get the word out. I wonder how we can collectively increase the awareness of our Club in our community.

Let's act on our theme – Outreach!



Monthly board meeting highlights (10/9):

President Mike O'Brochta emphasized that his theme for the year is "Outreach," combining the goals of better addressing community needs confronting youth, the elderly and the environment, while also publicizing our efforts and making the club a "less well-kept secret." The theme will be prominently advertised throughout the year. Past President Jim Arend passed away October 4. As Jim was an active club member for 35 years, his presence will be deeply missed.

We ended the 2022-23 Kiwanis year with 147 members, +2 for the year.

The board approved a proposed budget from the grants committee as well as those submitted by the administrative and service budget committees. Next year's total service budget will be \$135,000, the largest in club history.

Other actions included:

Resurrecting a Career and Technical Education program will be explored this year, depending upon specific board member interest.

Additional funds will be allocated for club communications this year, including digital advertising and supporting a speakers' bureau to address outside groups.

The Strategic Plan Committee has already met and a questionnaire directed to members is included in this newsletter.

The new directory is on target to go to press by the end of October.

Kiwanis Foundation of Roanoke President Don Wilson was recognized for concluding a successful three-year term, including serving as a member of the club board during that time.

Convention ribbons from a century ago

Secretary John Montgomery visited an estate sale a couple of weeks ago and came upon a rare find – DCON and ICON delegate ribbons from the 1930s. They once belonged to Norman McVeigh, Kiwanis Club of Roanoke president in 1933. McVeigh, founder of the grocery chain Mick-or-Mack, attended many Capital District Kiwanis conventions over the years and evidently kept his bling. One of the badges was from the Kiwanis International convention held in Los Angeles in 1933, 90 years ago! The DCON ribbons included Baltimore, Lynchburg, Washington and Roanoke, all among the 10 oldest clubs within the Capital District, and all still active today. McVeigh, who died in 1974, was one of 10 Roanoke Kiwanians who launched our club's foundation in 1955.
