

REV. DR. AMY CHRISTINE HODGE WAS BORN IN A SMALL TOWN CALLED KOELHER WHICH IS BETWEEN MARTINSVILLE AND FIELDALE, VIRGINIA. SHE IS A 4TH GENERATION AFRICAN METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH MEMBER. SHE IS NAMED AFTER HER GREAT-GREAT GRANDMOTHER AMY FINNEY WHO WAS BORN A SLAVE AND IMANCIPATED AT THE AGE OF 15 YEARS OLD. SHE IS THE DAUGHTER OF DOROTHY FINNEY ESTES WHO WAS A LIFELONG MEMBER OF MEADOWVIEW AME CHURCH. PASTOR HODGE HAS 2 SISTERS AND THREE BROTHERS. ONE OF HE SISTERS, ELDER NAOMI HODGE MUSE IS AN ASSISTANT PASTOR AT GRACE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN MARTINSVILLE, VA. SIS. ESTES DECLARES THAT PASTOR HODGE HAS BEEN PREACHING SINCE SHE WAS FOUR YEARS OLD.

REV. DR. HODGE HAS 3 ADULT WELL EDUCATED, MARRIED

CHILDREN-MELINDA(BRIAN) FORD WHO HAVE 2 CHILDREN. APRIL(REGINALD)JONES WHO HAVE 1 CHILD AND PAUL(NECOLE) GILL WHO HAVE 2 CHILDREN. SHE IS THE PROUD GRANDMOTHER OF BRANDON FORD-19, A RISING SENIOR AT A&T UNIVERSITY IN GREENSBORO, NC., MELINA FORD 9, REGINALD JONES III, AGE 18 WHO IS ENTERING TEMPLE UIVERSITY IN PHILADELPHIA IN THE FALL, TRISTAN GILL 5 YEARS OLD AND MILES GILL 2 AND 1/2 MONTHS OLD.

SHE IS A GRADUATE OF PATRICK HENRY COMMUNITY COLLEGE-VIRGINIA SEMINARY AND COLLEGE, AND VIRGINIA UNIVERSITY OF LYNCHBURG. SHE RECEIVED HER MASTER OF DIVINITY AT THE SAMUEL DEWITT PROCTOR SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY AT VIRGINIA UNION UNIVERSITY IN 2011. SHE HAS MATRICULATED AT SAMUEL DEWITT PROCTOR SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY AS A DOCTORAL CANDIDATE. SHE HAS RECEIVED AN HONORARY DOCTOR OF DIVINITY FROM EASTERN THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY FOR COMMUNITY SERVICE AND CIVIC ENGAGEMENT. SHE MOST RECENTLY WAS EMPLOYED AT THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AS A COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT HEALTH COORDINATOR. SHE WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE POSITIONING OF VACCINATION CLINICS IN NEIGHBORHOODS WHERE PEOPLE OF COLOR HAD NOT HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO BE VACCINATED. HER MOTTO IS, "EDUCATE BEFORE YOU VACCINATE". SHE IS NOW THE FOUNDER AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF KINGDOM COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES, A NON-PROFIT THAT DELIVERS EDUCATION AND RESOURCES IN AREAS WITH DISPARITIES AND INEQUITIES.

PASTOR HODGE WAS RECENTLY APPOINTED TO THE VIRGINIA HEALTH COMMISSIONERS ADVISORY COUNCIL ON HEALTH EQUITY AND DISPARITY.

SHE IS A MEMBER OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE NAACP, THE NORTHWEST FAITH PARTNERSHIP, AND (LOV) LADIES OF VISION OF ROANOKE. SHE HAS RECEIVED NUMEROUS AWARDS FOR COMMUNITY SERVICE. SHE IS A COMMUNITY AMBASSADOR FOR THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. SHE ACTUALLY MADE AND DISTRIBUTED THOUSANDS OF MASKS IN THE ROANOKE VALLEY, AT THE ONSET OF THE PANDEMIC. SHE IS AN ADVOCATE FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE AND CHANGE. SHE FORMED AN UNDERGROUND RAILROAD THAT ALLOWED PERTINENT INFORMATION AND KNOWLEDGE TO TRAVEL TO THE PEOPLE OF COLOR THROUGH LOCAL PASTORS AND FRIENDS TO INSURE THAT PEOPLE OF COLOR RECEIVED VACCINATIONS. MOUNT ZION A.M.E CHURCH HAS HOSTED 8 CLINICS AND SEVERAL COMMUNITY EVENTS SINCE 2020.

REV. DR. AMY CHRISTINE HODGE IS A TRAILBLAZER AND HAS SUCCEEDED IN MANY FIRST. IN THE YEAR 2000 SHE BECAME THE FIRST FEMALE PASTOR OF BETHEL AME CHURCH OF ROCKY MOUNT, VIRINIA. IN THE YEAR 2002, SHE BECAME THE FIRST FEMALE PASTOR TO OVERSEE CONSTRUCTION OF A CHURCH FROM START TO FINISH IN 144 YEARS OF THE VIRGINIA ANNUAL. IN 2007 SHE BECAME FIRST FEMALE PASTOR OF MOUNT ZION AME CHURCH. SHE RECEIVED HER 17TH APPOINTMENT AS PASTOR OF MOUNT ZION IN MAY, 2023. SHE IS ONE OF THE FIRST FEMALES TO PASTOR A CHURCH IN THE VIRGINIA CONFERENCE WITH A TOP TEN RANKING.

MANY PEOPLE KNOW REV. DR. AMY CHRISTINE HODGE AS REV. AMY HODGE ZIGLAR. SHE MADE A PERSONAL DECISION TO RECLAIM HER BIRTH NAME AMY CHRISTINE HODGE WHICH MEANS TO LOVE LIKE CHRIST WITH HONOR. THERE IS A LOT IN A NAME AND SHE BELIEVES THAT HER NAME IS THE RIGHT NAME TO SERVE GOD'S PEOPLE FOR SUCH A TIME AS THIS. HER MOTTO IS "I WALK BY FAITH AND NOT BY SIGHT"
