

Chief Booth started his law enforcement career with the Richmond, Virginia, Police Department in 1996, where he served for nearly twenty years. During his tenure with the Richmond Police Department, he held positions as a patrol officer, undercover officer, detective in the Vice/Narcotics Units, SWAT team member, Honor Guard member, Firearm/drug enforcement unit sergeant, sergeant at the training academy, detective supervisor in the Narcotics Unit, Sector Commander, Watch Commander, Precinct Commander, Special Investigations Division Commander, Operations Major and Major in charge of the Office of Professional Responsibility/Internal Affairs. While serving with the Richmond Police Department, Chief Booth focused on the reduction of violent crime, community engagement, and working proactively with neighborhoods to effectively recognize and respond to problems.

Rev. Joe Cobb believes that our greatest calling as human beings is to love one another by honoring and celebrating what makes us unique and by discovering what we can create together. 



I wanted to let you know that I received the card signed by all the Kiwanians, and WOW – it brough on some tears. Week after week it's not uncommon for us to sign cards to those who need to know we love them, are thinking of them, praying for them... I always say a little prayer of comfort when I sign my name to those cards, and I genuinely believe I'm not the only one after receiving the card from my fellow Kiwanians. Something that seems so simple and easy can have such a big impact on someone's day – I know it did for me!

I had my 3rd ENT appointment on Friday and have been diagnosed with Migraine Associated Vertigo and Dr. Gross (who is amazing) is referring me to a neurologist to see about the nystagmus, which at it's worst happens every 45 minutes I am awake. Needless to say, driving has not been in the cards. I am scheduled for an MRI on Wednesday and look forward to the call from the

#### **Board Meeting Highlights from January 8th, 2024**

Two new members, Fred Jeter and Matt Trantham, attended to fulfill one of the requirements for their permanent member badges. The Board approved the membership application from Eric Sichau, President of the Roanoke Regional Chamber of Commerce, bringing us to 149 members – No. 1 in the Capital District. Treasurer, Membership Committee, Communications Committee, Strategic Planning Committee, and Foundation gave updates. Greg Lionberger and Kevin Reeder reviewed information regarding Kiwanis Corporate Membership, including input from several clubs that have that option. Joyce Montgomery is working on an update to our Club history for the 104th Club Anniversary Observance on Jan 31. Bob Habermann reported that the Club has participated in an application for a grant to study urban heat islands, and VT received a \$1,000,000 grant; more opportunities to assist in this effort are forthcoming.

The Capital District Midyear Convention will be held in Glade Spring, WV, on March 8-10; Jeanne Bollendorf, Joyce Montgomery, and David Hartman will be our Club's delegates.
