

The presentation will be an overview of Virginia's current spending on natural resources v. the economic impact natural resources in the state delivers. Understanding the minimal current funding levels of natural resources, VIRGINIA forever, a diverse group of business and NGO leaders, is the only non-profit to focus soley on funding further investment in water quality and land conservation.

As Executive Director of VIRGINIA forever, Karri works with a board group of businesses and NGO's to advocate for funding of water quality and land conservation projects in Virginia. Previously, she served as Director of Legal Services for the Environmental Health Division at the Virginia Department of Health and as Assistant Attorney General in the Office of the Attorney General state agencies such as The Virginia Department of Health, Environmental Quality, Forestry and Energy. She is also an Adjunct Professor at Radford University Waldron School of Health and Human Services teaching Public Health Law and Ethics. She also sits on the Roanoke City Planning Commission, where she served as a Planning Commissioner since 2017.



April 10 - Club Meeting, Legislative Update with Sam Rasoul and Chris Head

State Senator Chris Head represents the 3rd district in the Senate of Virginia. Previously served 12 years in the House of Delegates and served as Co-Chair of Virginia's Small Business Commission. In 2022, he was awarded the Free Enterprise Award from the Virginia Chamber of Commerce and the Industrial Strength Leadership Award from the Virginia Manufacturers Association. He is a husband, father, grandfather, business owner, and Kiwanian who lives in Botetourt County and owns a senior care business in Roanoke along with Betsy, his wife of 34 years.

The son of immigrants from Palestine, Sam grew up in Roanoke, where his family operated a corner store. As a religious and ethnic minority in Southwest Virginia, Sam learned the value of building bridges wherever he could find them.

Sam Rasoul has served Virginians since 2014, representing his hometown Roanoke, where he lives with his wife and three children. He currently Chairs the House Education Committee and sits on the Appropriations and Public Safety Committees. Sam has a background in healthcare administration, nonprofit management, and finance.

As the only Democrat in the western half of Virginia serving in the General Assembly, Sam works frequently across the aisle to bring positive, bipartisan, change to Southwest Virginia.

His guiding philosophy starts with the Golden Rule: Treat others as you would want to be treated. Sam leads with his values of Truth, Love, and Grit.

We were saddened to learn of the Thursday passing of former Kiwanis Club of Roanoke leader Bob Bersch. He was 88.

Bob was an extremely active club member for more than 30 years, joining Kiwanis in 1978. He served as club president in 1985-86 and famously conducted our club's new member inductions for an extended period of time. He also served as Lt. Governor and was very involved in numerous Capital District activities. He helped found the Big Lick Kiwanis Club, which met Tuesday mornings at The Roanoker Restaurant for decades.

A proud graduate of the University of Virginia and the College of William & Mary, Bob practiced law for 60 years, retiring in 2020 after selling his business Wills on Wheels.

At one time, Bob was part of the local law firm that had included Linwood Holton and Caldwell Butler, local attorneys who distinguished themselves nationally in political positions.

Bob is survived by his wife, Martha, who also belonged to the Kiwanis Club of Roanoke. We extend our sincere sympathies to her.

A celebration of Bob's life will be held Wednesday, April 3, at 11 a.m. at Second Presbyterian Church in Roanoke.

Kiwanians – It's Marathon Time Again! April 20, 2024

This year the Club will be running an Aid Station in support of the race. Specifically, we will be staffing BRP Roanoke Mountain Middle at the Near Roanoke Mountain Overlook, Roanoke Mountain Rd, Roanoke, VA 24014 (click the link to see the location on Google Maps https://goo.gl/maps/gajAaWG8zaa1wbZF8) handing out drinks and enthusiastically encouraging the runners. The shift starts at 6:45 and ends around 10:45 AM. You can drive up to the Aid Station by taking the Roanoke Mountain Parkway (on the right off the Blue Ridge Parkway just north of the intersection with Mill Mountain Parkway).

Note: Volunteers must be in place BEFORE the Blue Ridge Parkway closes at 7:00 AM!

If 6:45 AM is too early for you, we also need at least three (3) Kiwanians to be course marshals and there are volunteer opportunities on other days including Friday night (April 19th) at the welcome concert. Fifteen (15) volunteers are needed overall. Use the QR code below or click this link to https://runsignup.com/Race/Volunteer/VA/Roanoke/BlueRidge#43929.
