The iconic Roanoke Star atop Mill Mountain will be temporarily renamed for Susan Williams

For the fifth year in a row, the **Kiwanis Club of Roanoke** is temporarily renaming Roanoke's iconic star atop Mill Mountain. This year's honoree is, **Susan Williams**.

The ceremony will include remarks by Jeanne Bollendorf (President, Roanoke Kiwanis); Mayor Dr. Joe Cobb; and Ron Boyd (President, Local Office on Aging). A plaque honoring Susan Williams will be unveiled on Tuesday, August 5, immediately following the remarks.

The Kiwanis Club of Roanoke, the leading civic organization in the Roanoke Valley and the 17th largest Kiwanis Club in the world, has worked with the City of Roanoke to temporarily rename the neon star that overlooks the Roanoke Valley since 2021. She championed efforts to ensure that homebound individuals received nutritious meals and also vital social connection.
