


President's Message

August has been a busy time for our Kiwanis Club! Many thanks to club members Joyce Montgomery, Mike McEvoy, and Eric Danielsen for planning a wonderful **Roanoke Star Dedication** event. This year, instead of running a silent auction, we reached out directly to a corporate sponsor, and **Roanoke Gas Company**generously came forward. RCG asked us to choose someone in our community to honor and our club leadership chose **Susan Williams**, who tragically lost her life earlier this year. Susan retired from LOA after more than 30 years and was responsible not only for their rebranding, but also establishing the Meals on Wheels program. Major Joe Cobb and CEO of

LOA, Ron Boyd spoke eloquently of Susan's life and legacy in our community. We welcomed several members of Susan's family, who were very honored to have her remembered.

In addition to the Star dedication, we co-sponsored two new youth oriented events in Roanoke County - we partnered with Roanoke County Police and Carilion Clinic for Cuts with Cops was a back-to-school event providing haircuts, new shoes, and school supplies. Commonwealth Day of Play was in partnership with the Greater Williamson Road Area Business Association, Brookside Golf, and the Governor's office. Families were invited to put their phones down for a few hours and enjoy free outdoor games, golf, ice cream, and other refreshments. Both events will take place again next year and we hope to continue our involvement and get some Kiwanians out there on the golf course with young people!

On a more serious note, many have heard and read about the tragic arson attack on **Danville Councilmember**, **Lee Vogler**. We have been saddened to learn both the victim and the perpetrator have ties to the Daville Kiwanis Club. The Danville club is not asking for assistance, however, Mr. Vogler's family has a **GoFundMe**to help raise money for his ongoing hospital care and also to help his wife take care of their home and children. Mr. Vogler will be in the hospital for at least six months receiving burn treatments and neither he nor his wife will be receiving work income. Participants Needed for Motor Control Study

Professor Sean Cochran of Roanoke College - who is speaking to us about using Virtual Reality to improve health outcomes is inviting our Kiwanis Club members to participate in the Roanoke College research. He has sent Cheri Hartman this blurb as an explanation of the study.

Join a research study in the Health and Exercise Science department at Roanoke College exploring how fitness affects upper limb motor performance! Participants will complete a drawing task using both arms under altered visual conditions and then asked to walk for 2 minutes at a comfortable pace, wearing a heart rate monitor. This will be for just one session lasting around 45 minutes. Not only will you be assisting our understanding of how to improve physical rehabilitation protocols, but you will be assisting undergraduate students grow their skillset of becoming independent researchers! Among the items of business we addressed:

- ~ Discussed the health concerns of several Kiwanians (both in Roanoke and other clubs) and how the club might offer appropriate assistance. Our Kiwanis Kares committee is leading the way;
- ~ Accepted the resignations with regret of Kiwanians Mike Adams (moving to Georgia) and Stephanie Moon Reynolds (life and career changes);
- ~ Approved the application of new member Mike Franzese, a relocated realtor

(jointly sponsored by Fred Jeter and Jeff Vick);

- ~ Approved the September slate of programs, including: Dr. Sean Cochran, Roanoke College professor, speaking on Virtual Reality (September 10) and Jeff Sluss, SkillsUSA Virginia Foundation Executive Director (September 17). The club does not meet Labor Day Week and the installation of next year's officers will be a night meeting September 24 in Charter Hall. The September program coordinator is Kevin Reeder.
- ~ Discussed the highlights of recent activities including the July 23 Interclub at the Science Museum that 45 attended; the July 29 KPAD Debriefing (led by Operations Chair Mike McEvoy); and the August 5 Mill Mountain Star Dedication Ceremony in Memory of the late Local Office on Aging Executive Director Susan Williams, sponsored by Roanoke Gas.
