





August 27th - Club Meeting, Dr. Nick Rider, VTC School of Medicine

Join us Wednesday for our weekly meeting at 12:30 PM in Charter Hall on the third floor of the City Market Building to listen to Dr. Nick Rider, Professor at the Virginia Tech Carilion School of Medicine (VTCSOM). Dr. Rider will talk about translating Artificial Intelligence breakthroughs into improved patient care outcomes. He will cover the current state of artificial intelligence in healthcare with a focus on improving patient outcomes through system change. The month of August is dedicated to compelling speakers from VTCSOM.

Dr. Rider is a clinical immunologist with a longstanding interest in caring for patients with immune defects. He has worked at Texas Children's Hospital/Baylor College of Medicine in Houston Texas prior to coming to

Roanoke to work at VTCSOM. His expertise is also in clinical informatics and machine learning for health approaches.

SOCIAL – Mill Mountain Theater



Participants Needed for Motor Control Study

Professor Sean Cochran of Roanoke College - who is speaking to us about using Virtual Reality to improve health outcomes is inviting our Kiwanis Club members to participate in the Roanoke College research. He has sent Cheri Hartman this blurb as an explanation of the study.

Join a research study in the Health and Exercise Science department at Roanoke College exploring how fitness affects upper limb motor performance! Participants will complete a drawing task using both arms under altered visual conditions and then asked to walk for 2 minutes at a comfortable pace, wearing a heart rate monitor. This will be for just one session lasting around 45 minutes. Not only will you be assisting our understanding of how to improve physical rehabilitation protocols, but you will be assisting undergraduate students grow their skillset of becoming independent researchers!
