

John Shotwell, Nancy Horn's Fiancé

We were saddened to learn of the Thursday passing of Kiwanian Nancy Horn's longtime fiancé, John Shotwell. John died of congestive heart failure after battling cancer earlier this year. Over the years, John frequently attended Kiwanis functions with Nancy.

John was a popular teacher and successful coach at James River High School, coaching six sports over a 50-year period starting in 1961. He won four state softball championships and helped develop pitcher Angela Tincher O'Brien,

who was named the NCAA softball player of the year in 2008 while playing for Virginia Tech. John was a member of the Virginia High School League hall of fame. He was renowned for youth development.

"He was able to have great relationships with the people that he coached," Tincher O'Brien told reporter Mark Berman of The Roanoke Times. "He was really there for the relationships, which is why he was so well-loved by so many people."

Visitation for John will be held at Mill Creek Baptist Church in Botetourt County Nov. 21 from 3-7 p.m. The funeral will be held at the church Nov. 22 at 1 p.m.
